

## **PASTEL PAINTING**

#### Charcoal and Pastels

\*indicates optional items

- 1 6B Charcoal pencil
- 1 Box (10-20) soft sticks of vine charcoal, ¼" diameter
- \*1 Stick compressed charcoal "Char kole" optional
- 1 Box 48 colors Koss or Alfa pastels (soft pastels, other brands ok, such as Rembrandt)
- \*1 Stomp (looks like a tube of cardboard)
- \*1 Set Color tinted pastel gray chalks (Rembrandt, Harthmuth or other)
- \*1 Set General's Artist's Sketching charcoal-Pure Willow Assortment (optional)

#### Eraser

- 1 Each Vinyl (e.g., Kohinor Rapidograph PT20 or Staedtler Mars Puraplast, 526 59)

#### Paper

- 1 Pad each charcoal paper 9"x12" and 18"x24"
- 50 Sheets ordinary typing paper or discarded paper (used on one side only)

#### General

- 1 Chamois
- 1 Box Kleenex
- 1 Red folder with handles approximately 24"x31" (reinforce handles with duct tape.
- 1 Drawing board 24"x30"
- 3 Clips 3" wide (Boston Hunt makes good ones)
- 1 Roll masking tape
- 1 Tackle box or Art Bin for supplies or plastic box
- 4 Foam core sheets – two each: 9x12 and 24x30
- 1 Box push pins (100 pins)
- 1 Styrofoam meat tray
- 1 Plastic sheet protector
- 1 Pair scissors
- 1 Can workable fixative: Blair is best
- 1 Utility or matte knife or box of single edge razor blades
- 1 Roll duct tape
- 1 Small hand mirror approx. 3: x 3: or larger

Notes on Getting Cardboard

Large corrugated cardboard can be used to replace foam core which you can round up yourself (foam core is preferred as it is smooth). If you choose to use cardboard try to find light weight cardboard since it is easy to carry and to cut. Look for cardboard with a relatively smooth surface because you will be drawing on it. To cut cardboard, use a single edge razor blade, matte knife or utility knife. Cut away from your body, arms and hands. BE CAREFUL!
